COMMUNITY READ TALKING ABOUT DIVERSITY WITH YOUR CHILDREN





READ AND TALK

Diversity activities teach young children to respect and celebrate the differences in all people. Learning about different cultural backgrounds helps children realize we are all humans, despite differences in how we look, eat, or celebrate. -Penn State Extention

EXPLORE YOUR COMMUNITY



Explore opportunities in your community, such as cultural events and festivals. This is the perfect way to learn about different holidays, celebrations, food, etc. The earlier you expose your children to diversity and acceptance the more it will become a part of their values as they grow.

BE A ROLE MODEL

Children become culturally sensitive and respectful when they see their parents model these qualities and behaviors. Let your child witness you being an advocate for peace and equality. Take a strength based approach when discussing others who are different: that is, focusing on the positive traits and abilities of the person as well as their sameness.





WHY READING AND TALKING AT A YOUNG AGE IS SO IMPORTANT?

At about 2 years of age, children begin to notice gender and racial differences. Around 3 years of age children notice physical disabilities. -Penn State Extention

INFORM ABOUT DIVERSITY

Children are not colorblind-nor should they be! Rather than pretending differences don't exsist, let's recognize and celebrate differences, as wel as noting the things we have in common with others. Discuss other differences, too: abilities, beliefs, religions, etc.

DIVERSITY= DIFFERENCES


Don't be afraid to talk to your kids about race. Dismissing questions makes them feel that something is wrong. Research shows that having open dialogue with children about difference in race and ethnicity actually helps decrease prejudice, and increase acceptance.










STORY TIME!

Read together as a family and then talk about the book when you are done.
















Tell the table about yourself based on which color m&m you pull out of your bag
